



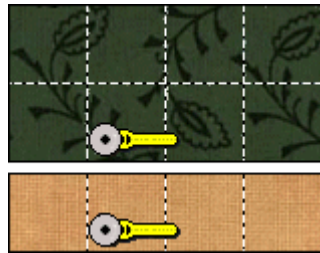
Sawtooth

This makes a 12" block!



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** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Start by cutting the Color 2 7" x 14" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares. Cut the Color 3 3-1/2" x 14" strip into four 3-1/2" squares...



Next cut the Color 3 3-1/2" x 26" strip into four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...



To make one flying geese unit, place a Color 2 square right sides together atop a Color 3 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew on this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another Color 2 square on the other end of the rectangle. Make four of these...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the center, and the middle row seam to the outside. Sew the rows together and you are all done with your Sawtooth block!

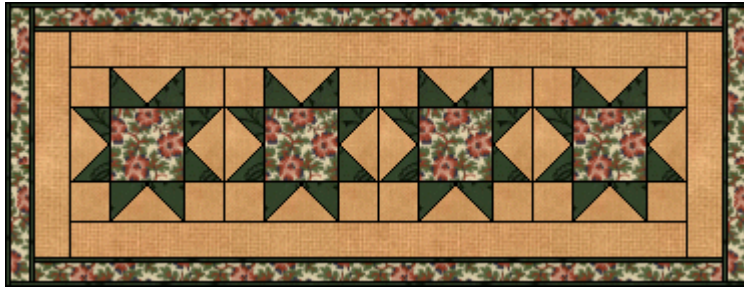
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Traditional Block

Color 1 needs: one 6-1/2" square



Color 2

Color 2 needs: one 7" x 14" strip



Color 3

Color 3 needs: one 3-1/2" x 14" strip AND one 3-1/2" x 26" strip
